





Goldhanger's Travelling Priest



Canon Francis Dobson
1909 - 1991

Francis Dobson was born into a catholic farming family and grew up at Hall Farm in Church Street. The family also farmed Gardeners Farm on the Maldon Rd and a photo on the cover is probably him as young lad in front of the WW-1 Flight Station hangars at the farm. His family said he always wanted to be a priest, he achieved that ambition and went on to become well known throughout Essex as the "Travelling Priest" as he toured many towns and villages in his own car celebrating Mass in many village halls, shops and houses. The British Legion hut in Fish St was one of the many venues he used for services.

He was educated at the Ursuline Preparatory School in Brentwood, and the Salesian School in Farnborough, Hants. In 1924 he went to Ushaw College at Durham. He was ordained at Maldon in 1932 and served in many Essex locations:- Southend, Colchester, Warley, Stock, Westcliff-on-Sea and Danbury.

As the Canon in Brentwood and Kelvedon between 1972 and 1980 he organised the creation of the Chapel-of-Ease in Tiptree, and in 1982 the Catholic Herald reported that Canon Dobson was presented with a free trip to Rome in celebration of his golden jubilee year by his parishioners at Kelvedon and nearby.

MISSIONER TAKES THE ROAD

Brentwood now has travelling priest

FR. Francis Dobson, 42-year-old parish priest of Our Lady of Mount Carmel's, Stock, Essex, has been appointed by Bishop Beck to take charge of Brentwood's first Travelling Mission.

An Essex man born and bred, Fr. Dobson—who as a boy used to go five miles by pony and trap to church—is regarded as the ideal choice for the heavy uphill work of penetrating outlying districts of his home county, with little beyond a Morris 8, high hope, and a knowledge of the countryside to sustain him. I have not yet mapped out a plan of campaign," Fr. Dobson told

me this week, "but my general aim will be to visit places off the beaten track, which contain about 1,000 people.

"Such villages usually have a few Catholics, and the first job will be to locate them.

Fr. Dobson begins his new undertaking this Sunday, celebrating two Masses "somewhere in Essex."

Do you have trust or confidence in something or someone? If you do, it's called faith.

Sometimes we don't even think about things, we take them for granted. For example, when we drive over the bridge at the Dartford Crossing we have confidence that we are not going to get wet feet. We have faith in the designers and builders of the structure and those who maintain it. Well, that is provided it's not too windy and all the other drivers act responsibly.

What some don't realise is that Jews, Christians, and Muslims all have faith in THE SAME God. The same God that they worship. How can that be? Some of them have been at war for centuries; apparently because of their faiths.

I was chatting to a friend a little while ago and discovered that we had diametrically opposing views about a particular foreign politician. I started to say how I felt, but quickly stopped as it was clear that we couldn't change each other's perspective. I've been thinking about that exchange and realised that tolerating and respecting each other's view is part of having friendship.

The Cambridge dictionary definition of tolerance is a "willingness to accept behaviour and beliefs that are different from your own, although you might not agree with or approve of them". If there had been more religious tolerance in the past, then there would have been fewer wars and conflicts. Think about Northern Ireland and the Middle East. However, it requires tolerance on all sides.

When it comes to faith, Jews, Christians, and Muslims all have their own way of life and yet they are aware of conflicts and uncertainties even within their own personal beliefs. Atheists have a belief system as well, and it has many questions. For example, they believe the universe exists by complete chance, they believe nothing exists beyond this life, and that ultimately science alone will explain everything. None of these can be proven. Agnostics are the people who "don't know". Where are you on that spectrum of faith?

If you've been to a church wedding, you may have listened to a bible reading that is frequently used. It emphasises the importance of love in the relationship. I'm sure you would support that view. It was written nearly 2000 years ago by Paul, one of the apostles of Jesus. He wrote his letter at Ephesus, in what is now modern Turkey, to the Christian church at Corinth, Greece. He said, "And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love". He supports all three. Love is important to all of us and so is hope and faith.

If reading this has made you wonder about your own beliefs, perhaps it would be helpful to sit quietly in a church, or outside in the churchyard, to try to pin down what you believe in. You would be away from the distractions of everyday life. Perhaps we just take our beliefs for granted. Sometimes we haven't really thought about them.

It's probably not a good idea to start thinking about your faith as you drive along the approach road to the Dartford Crossing!!!


The Book of Remembrance

Sponsor me!

Hello everyone,

Most people know me in the village, however if you don't I have lived here 30 years and have been on the Parish Council since 2013, bringing two boys up along the way.

I have competed in a number of long distance triathlons, but since a crohns diagnosis and a fairly significant operation, I have not felt like running, but have been motivated to swim.

In the summer a swim to Osea and back is just under 2 miles (about 3km) and takes just under an hour (on a good day). Last year I swam a 5km event in Docklands in September, then put away my swim stuff until I signed up to a somewhat longer swim this July.

Only after I had signed up did I take in the enormity of the challenge! Ullswater Lake in the Lake District is 7.5 miles (12km) long and this swim goes the whole length. So I had to commit to some serious training. I went to the pool (I'm not a fan of long cold winter swims in the river); at first my strength was really poor and my shoulder was painful, so I got some physio advice which, with continuous work has improved the shoulder significantly, and lots of swimming practice has improved my strength and swim speed.

Advice from other long-distance swimmers is to build training up to at least a 4 hour training swim before this event, which is likely to take 5 to 5.5 hours to complete. I'm now doing lots of swimming in the lake at Boreham (Trifarm), but there is still a long way to go. This is not going to be easy.....

So, the reason I'm rambling on is that I thought such a challenge could be used to raise some funds for a good cause. There are so many good causes so the choice is very difficult, but I have decided to raise money for the Alzheimer's society. So many families have lost a relative to the disease, my grandad included and my father-in-law is currently struggling living with it.

I would be really grateful for all sponsorship and donations.

Are you missing out on ways to reduce your bills? You may be eligible for these social tariffs.

Broadband and internet

If you are getting one of a variety of means tested benefits, you may be able to get a social tariff, making your bills much lower.

For example BT offer a Home Essentials plans from £15 a month.

First, check if your current provider offers a social tariff. You can apply for most tariffs online, or call your provider and ask to switch.

If your provider doesn't offer a social tariff, you can switch to one that does. Your provider might let you leave your current contract without paying a penalty fee.

Water

Essex and Suffolk Water offers a low income discount of up to 50% of your bill if one of the following applies to you:

- your total household income is less than £23,933, and your annual water and sewerage bill is more than 3% of your net household income (after housing costs, rent or mortgage payments) or
- someone in your household receives Pension Credit, and your annual water and sewerage bill is 3% or more of your net household income (after housing costs, rent or mortgage payments)

Watersure – bill cap scheme

This scheme caps your metered bill, so you don't pay extra if you need to use more water due to a large family or a medical condition that requires a lot of water, and you receive income-related benefits.

Energy

The Warm Home Discount Scheme is a one-off £150 discount off your electricity bill. If you're eligible, your electricity supplier will usually apply the discount to your bill automatically.

You qualify if you are on one of a variety of means tested benefits or on tax credits with a low income and have high energy costs. Your property must have a high energy cost score to be eligible for the scheme. This is not based on the actual energy costs in your energy bill. It's calculated based on your property's type, age and floor area.


The annual Sea Sunday is a day of focus on those whose lives are connected with the sea



Did you know there is a law about cleaning out nest boxes?

According to the British Trust for Ornithology, when the breeding season is over, old nests can be removed and the box cleaned out. Bird Protection Law permits the cleaning out of nests between 1st September and 31st January. Any dead eggs must be destroyed promptly and cannot be kept or sold.

Some hole-nesting species, including sparrows, may have second or third broods in the same nest. The nests of these species should be left until sometime during the autumn when it is certain that they are no longer in use.

Recipe of the month

Marmalade Ice Cream

It's summer time!

Preparation time

15 minutes plus freezing

Cooking time

About 8 minutes

Serves

Serves 6



Ingredients

- 100 g caster sugar
- 275 ml water
- 1 x 15 ml spoon lemon juice
- 4 x 15 ml spoons marmalade
- 300 ml plain unsweetened yogurt
- 150 ml double or whipping cream


Method

1. Put the sugar, water and lemon juice in a heavy-based saucepan and heat gently until the sugar has dissolved. Increase the heat and cook rapidly until the thread stage is reached (see below).
2. Stir in the marmalade and allow to go cold.
3. Stir in the yogurt. Pour the mixture into a freezer container and freeze for about 1 hours until mushy.
4. Beat the cream until it forms soft peaks. Fold into the yogurt mixture and freeze. Beat the mixture twice, at hourly intervals. Cover, seal and freeze.



(Using a small spoon, remove a little of the syrup and allow it to fall from the spoon onto a dish. The syrup should form a fine, thin thread when the correct stage has been reached.)
