## The Lords of the Manor of Goldhanger

For about 900 years the village had a Lord of the Manor. The title and role was started by William the Conqueror after the Battle of Hastings in 1066, which gave rights and responsibilities for land, including the governance and the dispensing of justice. Punishments could include fines, banishment, imprisonment or even the gallows. The Domesday Book, compiled in 1086, listed all the Manors and owners including those at Goldhanger who were Eustace, Count of Bologne, Hugh de Montfort and Ranulf Peveral. This title of lord is not the same as the title of a hereditary or life peerage, nor is it similar to today's use of the term landlord.

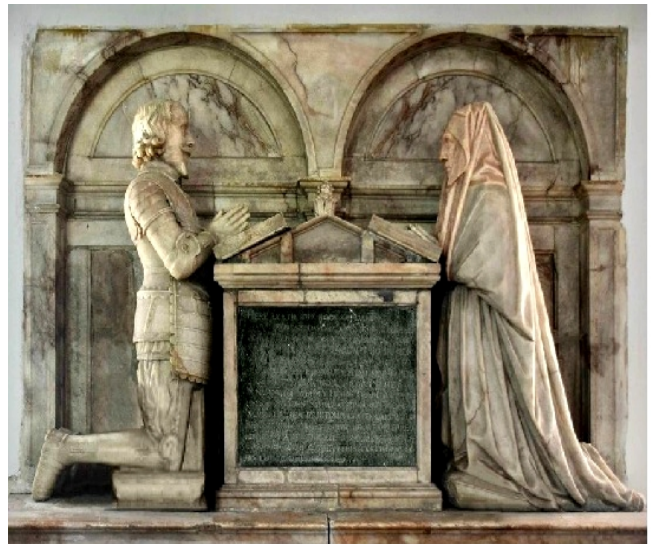
From the 1100s to the 1500s "Goldhanger-cum-Totham-Parva" shared the same Lords of the Manor and many of them resided at Little Totham Hall adjacent to All Saints Church. The earliest of these were three generations of the Jarpenville family, and they were followed by several generations of the Helveningshams.

If a tenant of the Manor was in dispute with the Lord, they were put before the Manorial Court, usually presided over by the lord's officer the Bailiff, who made a decision and imposed penalties on the tenant. At Goldhanger the Manorial Court was held in the building in The Square in the centre of the village which is now the Chequers Inn.

Charles Brandon, 1<sup>st</sup> Duke of Suffolk and Henry Coe Coape both lived at Vaulty Manor with a Goldhanger address. The last known Goldhanger Lord of the Manor in the 1890s was Frank Postle Bawtree a Witham solicitor and his business still exists. There must have been many more holding the title over the 900 year period; however we only know the names of twenty and have even less portraits.

We have several sources of names of the title holders: Maura Benham in *Goldhanger - An Estuary Village* and Lorna Key in *Little Totham - The story of a small village* identify many of the early Lords of the Manor, and some more recent holders of the title are identified in Trade Directories.

Perhaps the best known Lord of the Manor of "Goldhanger-cum-Totham-Parva" was, and still is, John Sammes whose impressive marble monument is in All Saints Church at Little Totham.....



From the mid 1800s here, and perhaps in other villages, some of the assets and roles of the Lord of the Manor seems to have been taken on by the Rectors, whose wealthy families purchased the "Benefice", and included the substantial rectories, Church farms and many tenanted cottages.

## Ministry Team message

According to the goodgoodgood website – and where else would I go? - the main days and months you should know about in November are:

Native American Heritage month	November
Hunger & Homelessness Awareness Week	November 11-18
Veterans Day	November 11
World Kindness Day	November 12
Trans Day of Remembrance	November 20
Giving Tuesday	November 28

It's a mixture of the spiritual and the physical. Other events occurring in the month are Remembrance Day which was physical when we could remember some of them, but is now more spiritual as we think of the sacrifices that were made. Now we have Victory in Europe, or VE Day which is in May and is more national than personnel and could last as long as the nation.

And the days get shorter and shorter and colder and colder, and we get Halloween which joins Remembrance Day in its ambiguity. It is actually the old English word for "holy person" or "to make holy." It's essentially a synonym for saint, but more archaic and poetic.

It also occurs as the first prayer in the Lord's prayer: Hallowed be thy name, and still just about survives in the concept of hallowed ground.

The word Halloween is a contraction of All Hallows' Even, which means the evening before All Hallows' Day (also known as All Saints' Day) celebrated on the first of November.

Before Christianity, October 31st was celebrated as Samhain by Celtic pagans—a festival marking the end of the harvest and the beginning of winter.

Between the 16th and 19th centuries, the name evolved through dialect shifts and literary trends. The apostrophe in Hallowe'en originally marked the missing "v" from even, a common stylistic choice in older English.

So, All Hallows' Even gradually morphed into Hallowe'en, and then Halloween.

The Church placed All Saints' Day on November 1st to align with and absorb the pagan celebrations, turning October 31st into a religious event.

I suppose that in absorbing the pagan festivities we've got to where we are today, where our children can enjoy an avalanche of tat to annoy the neighbours as the spirit moves them or their



parents allow. But then, as Jesus says, 'unless you become like little children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.'

And then there is Guy Fawkes Day or bonfire night, also the responsibility of the church, when Guy Fawkes, who was born in York, was so angry with the protestant church in England pushing aside the original Roman Catholic version, that he tried to blow up the House of Parliament in 1605, but King James got wise to this and ordered a search of the cellars underneath Parliament, which he did in the early hours of 5 November. Fawkes had taken up his station late on the previous night, armed with a slow match and a watch given to him by Thomas Percy, a co-conspirator, "because he should knowe howe the time went away". Fawkes was found leaving the cellar, shortly after midnight, and arrested. Inside, the barrels of gunpowder were discovered hidden under piles of firewood and coal. Not much spirituality there.

Roll on December.

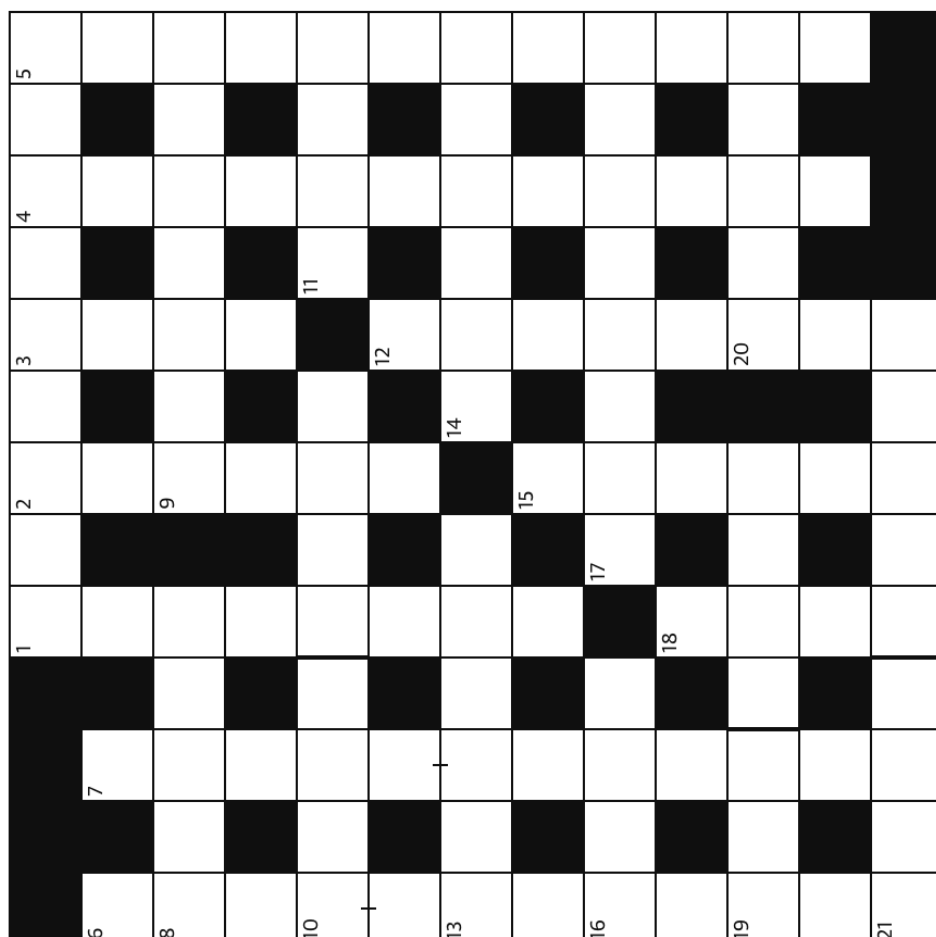

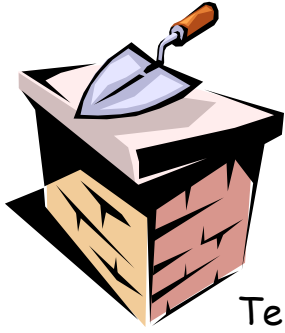

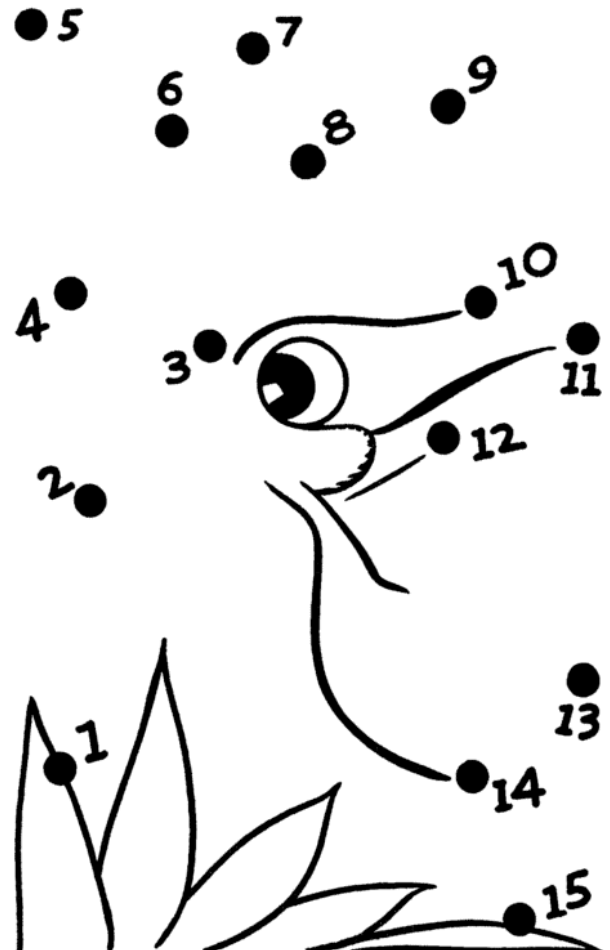

- Sea salt flakes

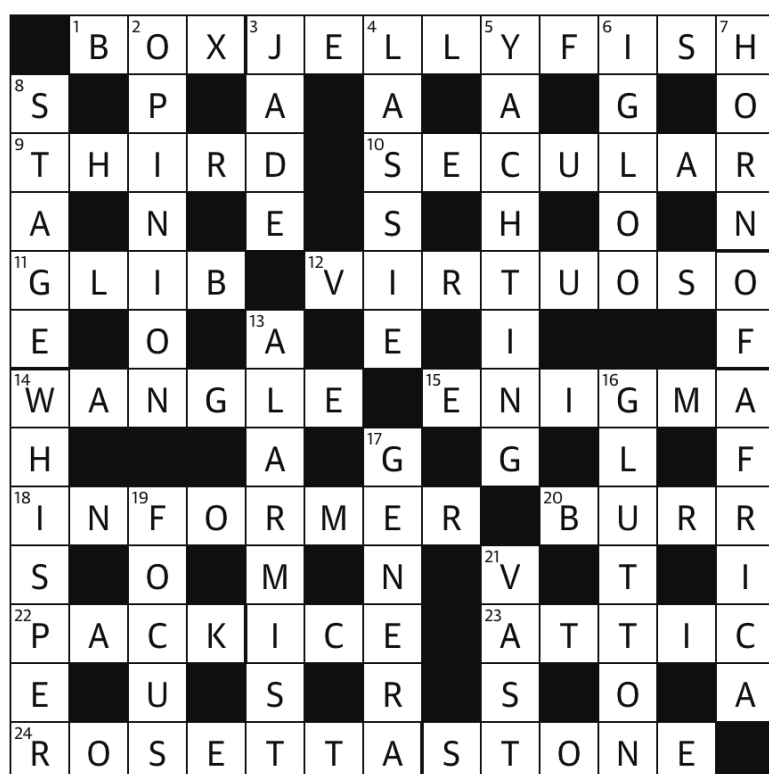
### **Method**

1. Heat the oven to 220°C/425F
2. Cut the vegetables into chunks roughly the same size
