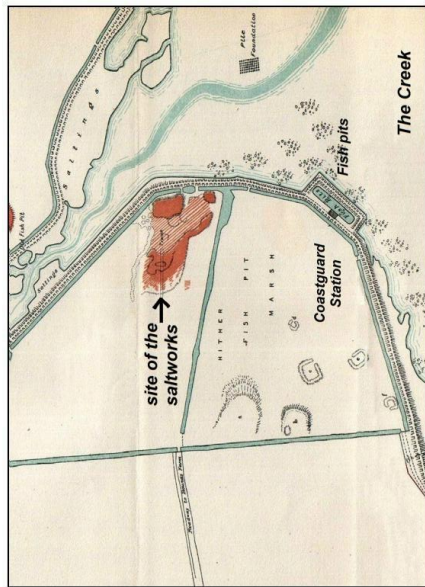

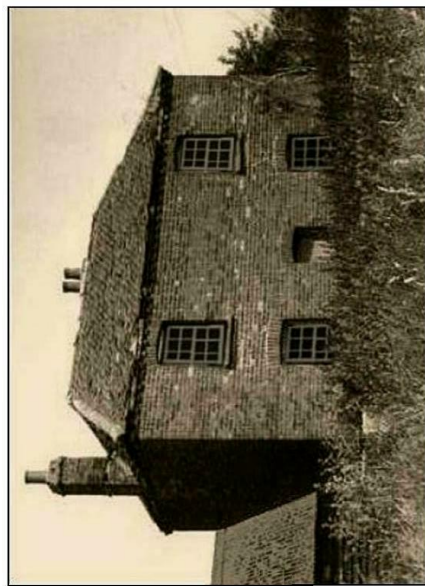

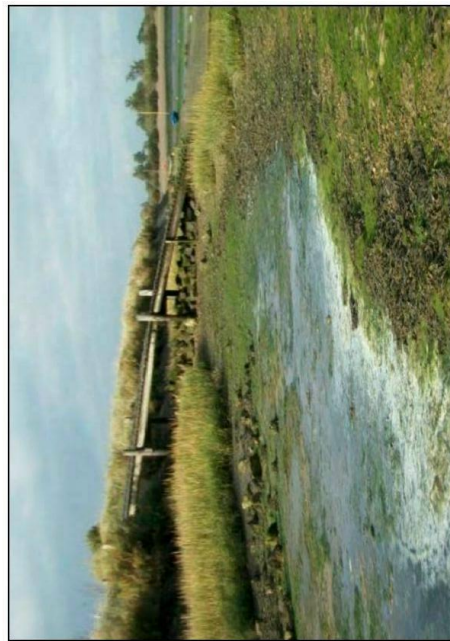

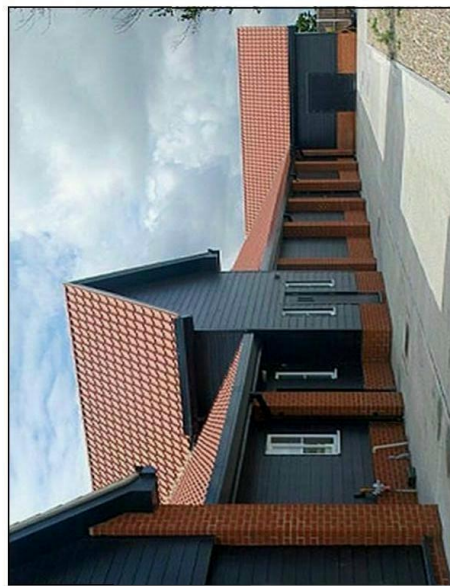

Goldhanger Saltworks

A Goldhanger saltworks was recorded in the 1086 Domesday Book, although the “Red Hills” close to the seawall are evidence of salt extraction from the Estuary since the Iron Age and early Roman period. Salt has always been vital for the preservation of fish, meat and cheese and has always had many other uses.

The Blackwater Estuary is known to have the saltiest seawater in the UK, due to a combination of climate and the saltmarsh terrain on the north side. The water is at its saltiest once every two weeks at the high tide so the water is collected at that time and stored in lagoons and tanks for later processing.

For hundreds of years the Goldhanger saltworks was located at Bounds Farm close to the Fish Pits and where the Sailing Club is today. It disappeared in the early 1800s when a bigger and more efficient plant was built at Saltcote Mills on the Goldhanger Road towards Heybridge. The salt from there was always called “Maldon Sea Salt”. In the late 1800s that was replaced by a saltworks sited by the river in Maldon town centre. This was when cheap salt from Cheshire salt mines became available and the Maldon Company responded by offering tourists hot and cold sea salt baths on the riverside at a time when Spar towns were popular.

The Company’s fortunes changed again when Delia Smith extolled the benefits of Maldon Sea Salt in her 1970s BBC TV cookery series and the business has been growing ever since, now selling the produce around the world. To satisfy the need for more seawater in 2006 the Company acquired isolated Longwick Farm on the eastern edge of Goldhanger parish, and replaced the derelict farmhouse with a new processing plant which has expanded several times over the years.

A planning application in 2024 for a new office and packing facility at Langford noted that the salt is taken from the Blackwater at Goldhanger, but it seems unlikely that the product will be renamed “Goldhanger Salt” any time soon.

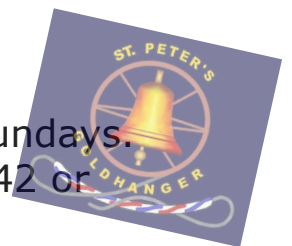

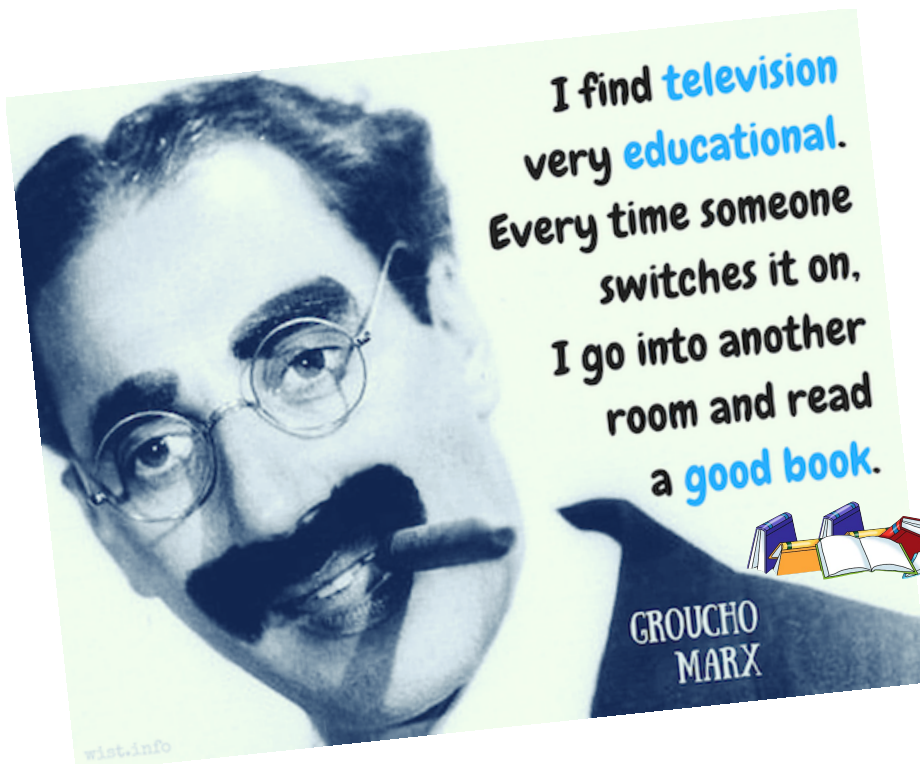
From the Editors

Asset of Community Value – A new application had been made and a decision would be made by the end of the Oct at the latest

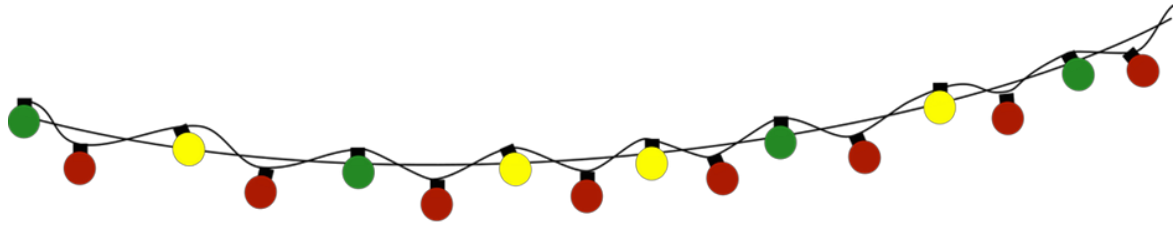
There has been a water leak on the Main Road in front of Benhams Close

Work on the Fish Street surface water drain started this week

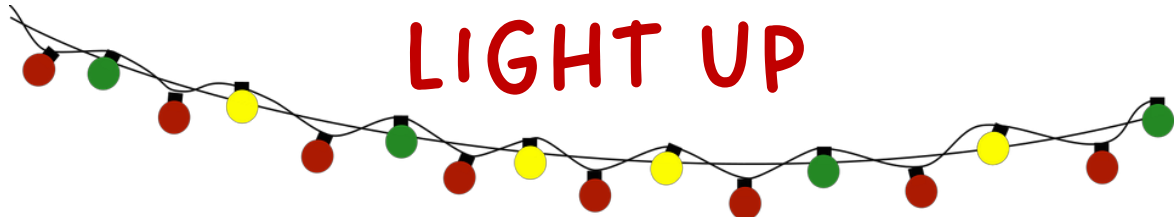

Ministry Team Message

SO here we are in October....very much a month when little seems to happen.

The Last Night of the Proms – the closing act of Summer in my book – is already forgotten.

All Saints Day, All Souls Day, Remembrance Sunday and Advent all lie ahead on the path to Christmas.

Outside the days are growing darker and gloomier (probably! Who dares to predict the weather at this time of Global Warming!) The nights are drawing in and I find once again in my head the nagging memory of those so evocative words from one of T.S.Eliot's Preludes:

"The burnt-out ends of smoky days.

And now a gusty shower wraps

The grimy scraps

Of withered leaves about your feet."

But hey-up! Wait a minute! We're Christians. With God within us and beside us, there will always be hope. The light of His love will shine bright in our hearts in even the darkest days.

During the course of this month (Trinity 17) we will hear as a Gospel; reading Luke's account of how Jesus cured ten lepers. One of them returns to thank Jesus who tells him: ***"Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well."***

This is one of those simple, straightforward little passages in which the miracle seems the point. But it's not really, is it? The true point is the ***"your faith has made you well."***

Jesus presents Himself here as a kind of conduit; He has "cured" the other nine lepers, but the one who returned had the faith to cure himself, and it only needed Jesus's presence for him to be able to unlock that faith.

We see this happening time and again through the Gospels: The onus is on us. Not on God. Not on Jesus. If our Faith is strong enough, if our Belief is good enough, and if our actions act out those qualities in our daily lives, we have the means, through God, of overcoming the metaphorical ills that daily threaten to drag us down.

Act with humility (the message from Trinity 14 and 15); Repent of our sins (Trinity 16); Be honest and trustworthy (Trinity 17).

Through this period of His mission Jesus is teaching us lessons in the Love of God to which we must all adhere if we are, eventually, to enter the Kingdom of God.

So, far from being a quiet time in our Christian life, the concluding passage of time in Trinity is vital to us.

"Not everyone that said to me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that does the will of my Father which is in heaven" we are told in Matthew, Chapter 7, verse 21).

As we proceed through October, the days ahead may seem dark and in keeping with a rather cynical saying I have heard: "Because of budget cuts the light at the end of the tunnel has been turned off."

But for us the light of God always awaits.

"I am the light of the World," we find Jesus saying in John Chapter 8. ***"Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."***

And then again, referring directly to us, during the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew Chapter 5) Jesus declares to His audience: ***"You are the light of the world.....let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in Heaven."***

A message to remember as the days are drawing in.

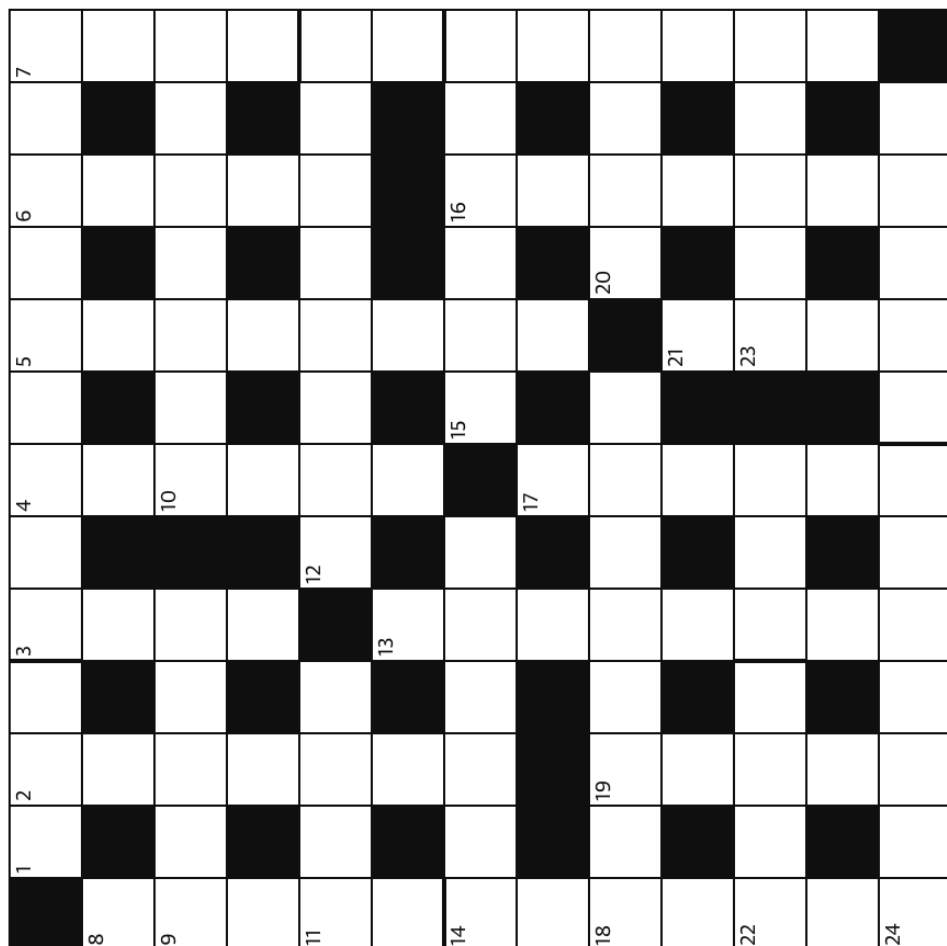

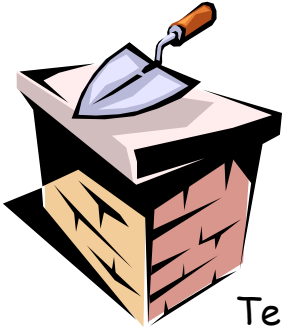

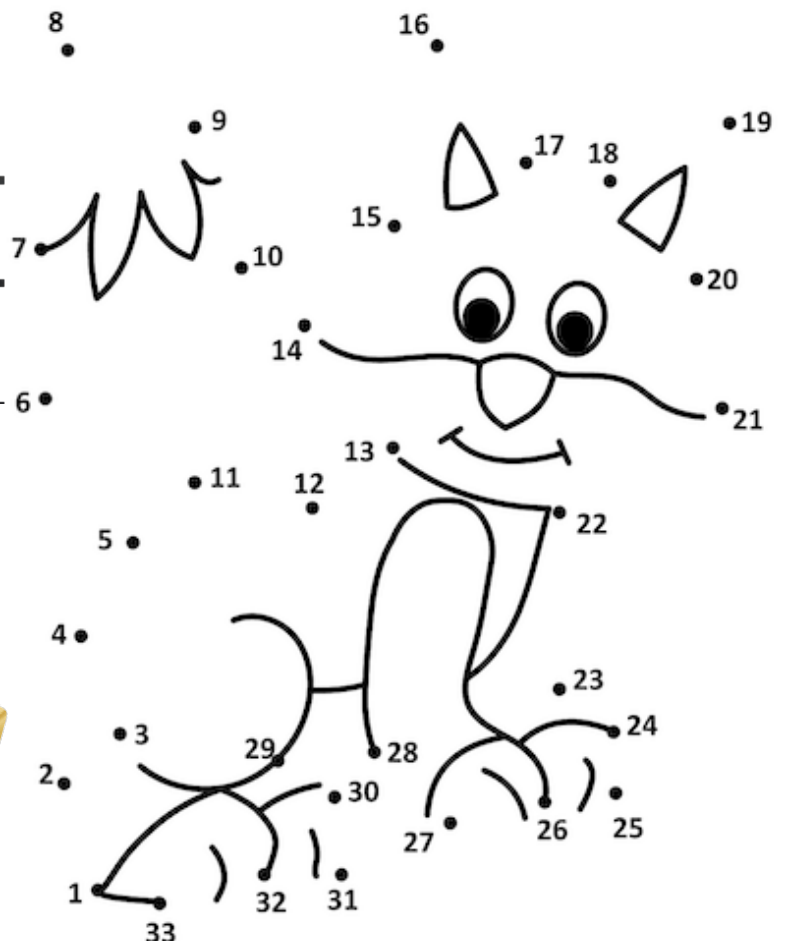

Ingredients

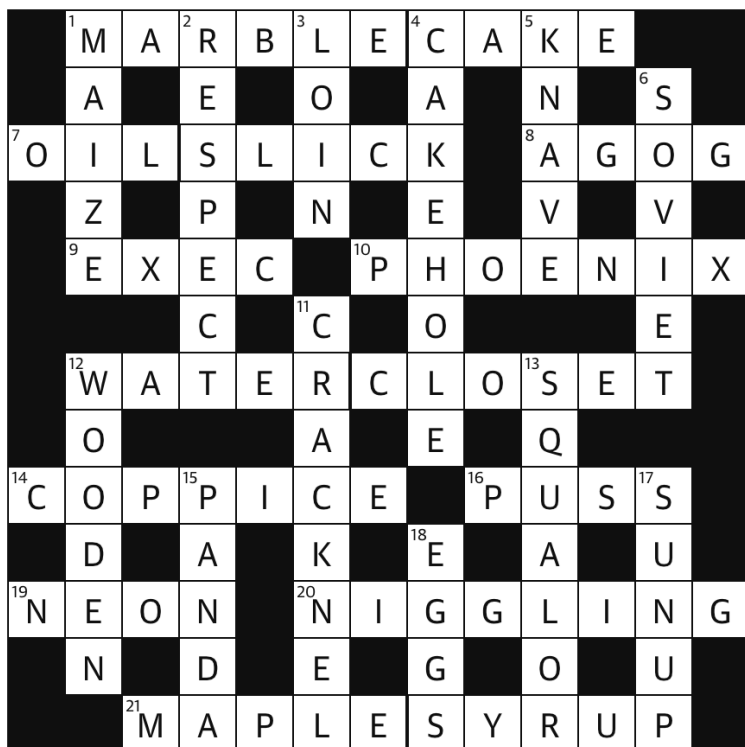
- 100g dried wholewheat noodles
- 50g peanut butter
- 1 tablespoon fresh grated ginger
- 1 tablespoon sweet chilli sauce
- 2 tablespoons tamari or soy sauce
- Juice of 1 lime
- 2 spring onions
- 1 tablespoon roast salted peanuts, finely chopped (optional)

Method

1. Cook noodles in boiling water with a good pinch of salt according to packet instructions.
2. Meanwhile, whisk sauce ingredients together in a bowl, adding 4 tablespoons of water to loosen the sauce.
3. Drain noodles, leaving a splash of water in the pan. Add the sauce, heat for a minute then toss through the noodles.
4. Garnish with the onions and chopped nuts (if using)
