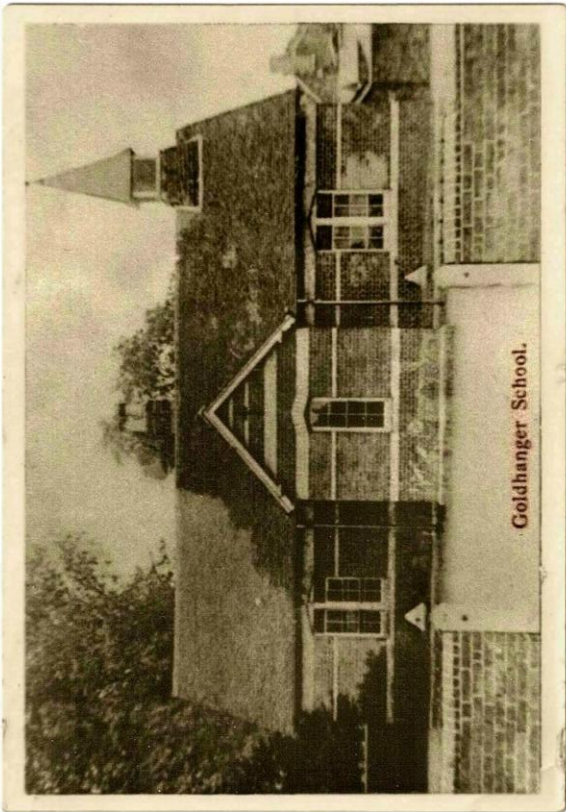
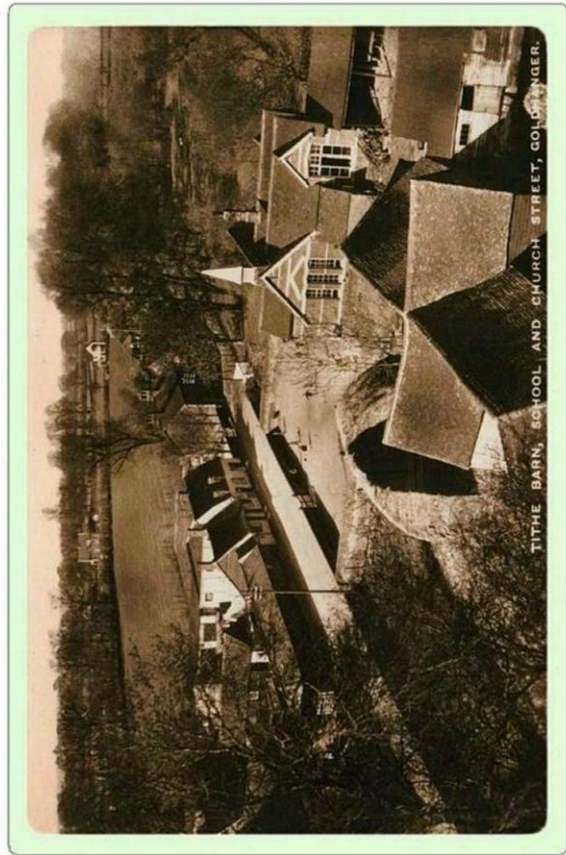

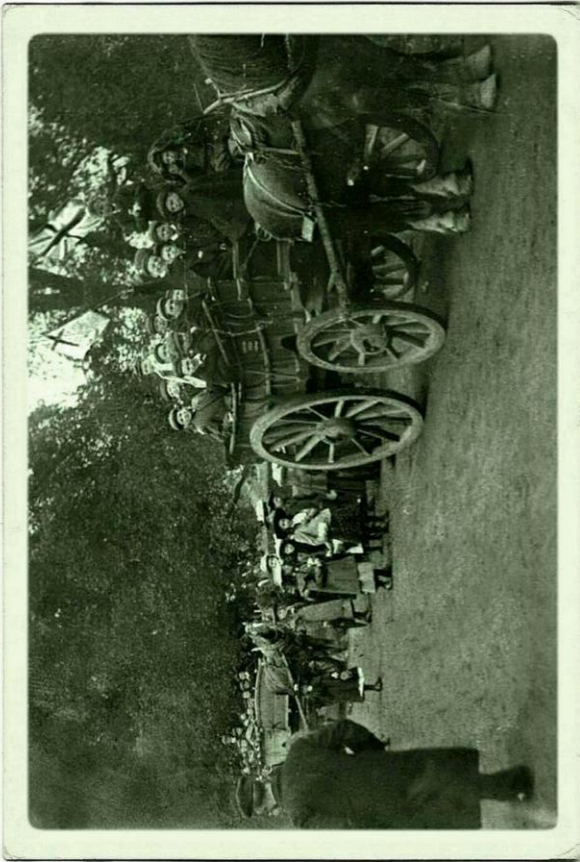
an early 1900s postcard view of the school

The 150th anniversary of the Village School

The Rector, the Revd Leigh and his family funded building of the School in 1875. Before then the Old Rectory and one of the Pit Cottages on the Maldon Rd Triangle had been used as school rooms. Here is a brief history of the school...

1890 - the average attendance was recorded as 106.

1895 - the Parish magazine made a plea for funds for the School.

1897 - the School was extended to add an infant's wing at the rear.

1899 - Kelly's directory recorded 92 children and 50 infants accommodated.

1904 - from the School Manger's minute book: School cleaning was undertaken by Mrs Chaplin for 3/- a week and Mrs Jordan for 2/6 a week. Wheels were purchased to carry away the contents of closet pails.

1916 - School children aged 13 permitted to do farm work during the war. The Rector used the School for war meetings as there was no Village Hall then.

1932 - joint lessons were held with Lt. Totham using a horse & wagon as transport.

1940 - a WW-2 air-raid shelter was built on the playground for the children.

1944 - the Butler Act resulted in Essex County Council's *Local Education Authority* taking over funding and full control of the School.

1975 - the School's 100 year anniversary was celebrated, including the gift of commemorative mugs to the children.

1977 - Essex County Council announced the closure of the School and the Church of England sold the building and lands privately to St Edwards School in Romford who used it as a "rural study centre" for their children. Villagers were not happy and the bellringers moved the bell from the School belfry to the church tower "for safe keeping".

1986 - a large extension was built at the front of the School as a dormitory.

1990 - St Edwards School put Goldhanger School and the land up for sale.

1996 - The School re-opened as a local day nursery and the bell was returned to the School belfry.

today - the School continues to operate as *Goldhanger Community Nursery*.

No Flags for September



MINISTRY MESSAGE FOR SEPTEMBER 2025

This year so far indicates a record average high temperature in the UK. At the time of writing water restrictions in various parts of the country are coming into force. Abberton and West Hanningfield reservoirs in July were reported together as being 84% full. Abberton had a massive increase in capacity in a twenty-year project completed in 2015.

As more and more people have water meters fitted overall usage has diminished as folk are more aware of the cost. The Government have committed to build nine new reservoirs by 2050.

The early hot weather must have been a challenging time for farmers in the agricultural sector with

rain in the South East coming just in time to help save the crop.

As holiday makers pray for sunny weather and farmers for rain God has a dilemma!

This year we had two serious water leaks at the rear of our cottage, both of which were attended

to efficiently by Essex & Suffolk Water who also recommended that we have a meter fitted to read

usage. Most homes with just one or two inhabitants make savings.

The water content of the average human body is 60%.

We are told to always ensure we keep hydrated, especially in hot weather, sensible advice.

Importantly water regulates our body temperature, protects and moistens the tissues and organs

of the body, helps dissolve minerals and nutrients to make them accessible to the body, carries

nutrients and oxygen to cells and helps the liver and kidneys to flush out waste.

A lovely episode recorded in the New Testament tells of Jesus, tired dusty and thirsty, coming

to a well for a drink. There he encounters a Samaritan woman whom he engages in conversation.

A Jewish man would not normally converse with a female stranger, especially a despised Samaritan

woman. It was mid-day, the hottest time of day when water would not normally be collected. He knows her background but doesn't judge her. She is convinced he is the Messiah. She leaves her water pot, anxious to return to her village to share her story there.

St John quoted Jesus as saying "If a person is thirsty let him come to me and drink.

Whoever believes in me streams of living water will flow from within"

A wonderful metaphor for the life-giving properties of this precious resource without which life on earth would not exist!

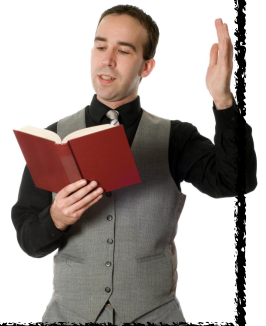
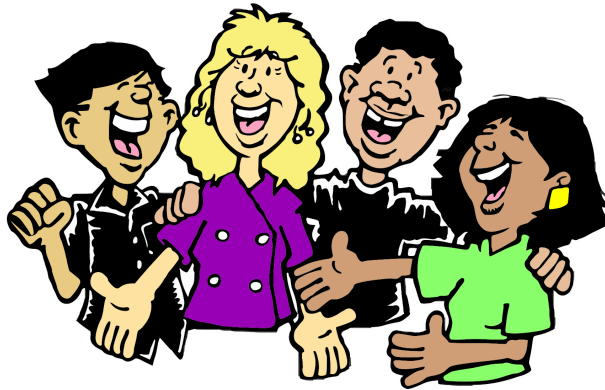
Sunday 21st September at 4pm in the Billiards Room of The Chequers will be the inaugural session of "Avago".

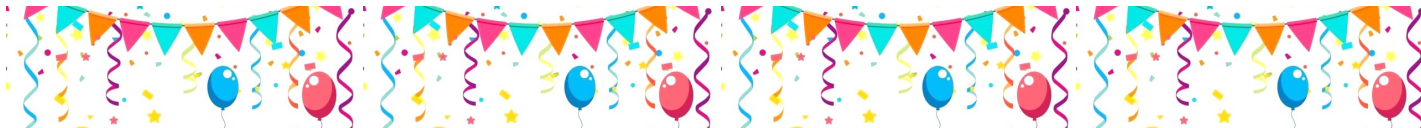

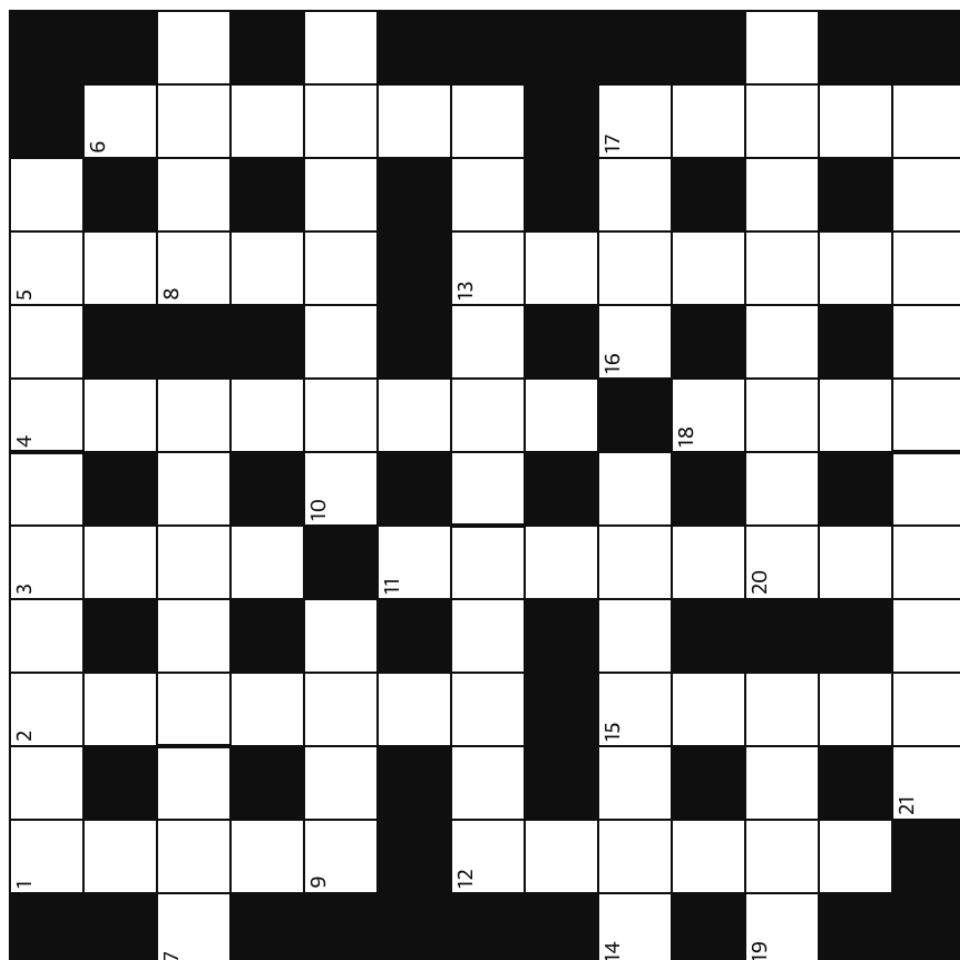

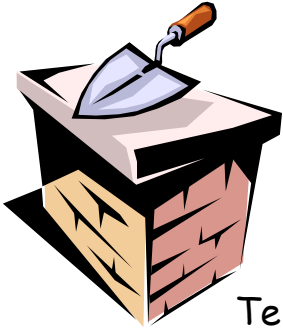

Recipe of the month

Butternut squash soup

Autumn draws on

Ingredients

- Butternut squash, about 1kg
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 2 onions diced
- 1 garlic clove thinly slices
- 2 mild red chillies, deseeded and finely chopped
- 850ml hot vegetable stock
- 4 tablespoons crème fraîche, plus extra to serve

Method

1. Preheat to oven to 200C/180C Fan/Gas 6.
2. Cut the squash into large cubes (about 4cms) then toss in a large roasting tin with half the olive oil. Roast for 30 minutes, turning once during cooking until golden and soft.
3. While the squash cooks, melt the butter and remaining oil in a large pan, add the onions, garlic and 3/4 of the chillies.
4. Cover and cook on a very low heat for 15-20 minutes until the onions are completely soft.
5. Tip the squash into the pan, add the stock and crème fraîche and whizz until smooth with a stick blender or use a food processor to get really smooth.
6. Reheat in the pan, season to taste. Serve in bowls with a swirl of crème fraîche and scattering the remaining chopped chilli.
